## INDEPENDENT AUDITOR'S REPORT

To the Board of Directors of the Progressive Conservative Association of Alberta

We have audited the accompanying Political Party Annual Financial Statement of the Progressive Conservative Association of Alberta, which comprises the statement of assets and liabilities as at December 31, 2016, and the summary of annual revenue, summary of annual expenses, annual surplus (deficit) and consolidation for the year then ended and other explanatory information. This financial statement has been prepared by management based on the financial reporting provisions of the *Election Finances and Contributions Disclosure Act-Alberta*.

Management's Responsibility for the Financial Statements

Management is responsible for the preparation and fair presentation of this financial statement in accordance with the financial reporting provisions of the *Election Finances and Contributions Disclosure Act- Alberta* and for such internal control as management determines is necessary to enable the preparation of a financial statement that is free from material misstatement, whether due to fraud or error.

Auditor's Responsibility

Our responsibility is to express an opinion on this financial statement based on our audit. We conducted our audit in accordance with Canadian generally accepted auditing standards. Those standards require that we comply with ethical requirements and plan and perform the audit to obtain reasonable assurance about whether the financial statement is free from material misstatement.

An audit involves performing procedures to obtain audit evidence about the amounts and disclosures in the financial statements. The procedures selected depend on the auditor's judgment, including the assessment of the risks of material misstatement of the financial statement, whether due to fraud or error. In making those risk assessments, the auditor considers internal control relevant to the entity's preparation and fair presentation of the financial statement in order to design audit procedures that are appropriate in the circumstances, but not for the purpose of expressing an opinion on the effectiveness of the entity's internal control. An audit also includes evaluating the appropriateness of accounting policies used and the reasonableness of accounting estimates made by management, as well as evaluating the overall presentation of the financial statement.

We believe that the audit evidence we have obtained is sufficient and appropriate to provide a basis for our qualified audit opinion.

#### Basis for Qualified Opinion

In common with many not-for-profit organizations, the Progressive Conservative Association of Alberta derives revenue from contributions, fundraising activities and membership sales, the completeness of which is not susceptible to satisfactory audit verification. Accordingly, verification of these revenues was limited to the amounts recorded in the records of the association. Therefore, we were not able to determine whether any adjustments might be necessary to contributions, fundraising, membership fees and annual surplus for the year ended December 31, 2016, current assets and net assets as at December 31, 2016.

#### Qualified Opinion

In our opinion, except for the possible effects of the matter described in the Basis for Qualified Opinion paragraph, the Political Party Annual Financial Statement of the Progressive Conservative Association of Alberta for the year ended December 31, 2016 is prepared, in all material respects, in accordance with the financial reporting provisions of the *Election Finances and Contributions Disclosure Act - Alberta*.

#### **Basis of Accounting**

Without modifying our qualified opinion, we draw attention to note 1 to the financial statement, which describes the basis of accounting. This financial statement is prepared to assist the Progressive Conservative Association of Alberta in complying with the financial reporting provisions of the *Election Finances and Contributions Disclosure Act - Alberta* referred to above. As a result, the financial statement may not be suitable for any other purpose.

# Notes to the Political Party Annual Financial Statement Year Ended December 31, 2016

#### 1. BASIS OF PRESENTATION

This financial statement has been prepared in accordance with the format and schedules prescribed by the *Election Finances and Contributions Disclosure Act - Alberta*.

The basis of presentation used in this financial statement materially differs from Canadian accounting standards for not-for-profit organizations in that all disclosures required under Canadian accounting standards for not-for-profit organizations are not provided.

In addition to this financial statement, the association has prepared audited financial statements in accordance with Canadian accounting standards for not-for-profit organizations except where those standards conflict with the requirements of the Act.

### 2. BANK INDEBTEDNESS

The Association has a line of credit authorized to a maximum of \$850,000. This line of credit is due on demand and bears interest at the bank's prime lending rate (2.7% as of December 31, 2016). The line of credit is secured by the Association's assets and a limited liability guarantee by a former director. As at December 31, 2016 the Association had drawn \$754,475 on the line of credit.

#### 3. PROGRESSIVE CONSERVATIVE ASSOCIATION OF ALBERTA FOUNDATION

The Progressive Conservative Association of Alberta Foundation is a company limited by guarantee, incorporated under Part 9 of the *Alberta Companies Act*. The objects of the company are to advance, promote, maintain, assist, establish and support the Progressive Conservative Association of Alberta. The company is inactive and does not maintain a bank account. All expenses related to the company are paid for by the association. These financial statements include expenses totaling \$nil related to the incorporation and sustaining of the company.
